





Ken and Linda Bohm's '48 Dodge panel truck wears a wide grin thanks to the '94 grille that's Rammed in its mouth. The Sterling, IL, couple had to customize the headlights and front wheel openings to accommodate the new grille, and the rear fenders also have been whacked and fitted the bod with custom taillights. The truck, originally built by Bob Roman in his home workshop, is powered by a '78 318 V8/904 T-Flite drivetrain. You'll find no Mustang II crapaola in this street machine, as the suspension is Dodge Aspen, complete with K-member, up front and an 8-3/4" rear with leaf springs that were quietly slid out from under a Barracuda (much to the 'Cuda owner's surprise). There's no dearth of creature comforts in this panel, as Bob Roman added A/C, cruise, power steering and brakes, 6-way power seat, tilt-tele wheel, and he fabbed a really neat wood dash.
